
A police officer will want to know your name. Make sure you have identification on you at all time.

## What is my address?

A police officer will want to know where you live in case they have to bring you home. Make sure you learn what your address is, or have an identification with your address written on it.









## What is my phone number?

A police officer will want to know the phone number of your emergency contact. Make sure you have the number easily accessible (on an identification card, or on your cellphone.)





### How to call 911

If you see or are involved in an emergency situation, you might need to call 911. Follow these steps to help you make the call.

#### 1. STAY CALM

It can very stressful in an emergency situation. Stay calm and find a phone.

#### 2. CALL 911

Do not hang up until you hear the person on the other line.

## How to call 911

#### 3. TELL THEM THE ADDRESS

Tell the person where you are. If you are not at home, tell them the closest address you see.


#### 4. WHAT IS THE EMERGENCY?

Tell the person on the phone why you are calling.

#### 5. DON'T HANG UP

If you are finding it difficult to speak after having made the call, don't hang up. The person on the line will try to trace your call and send help.

## staying safe around strangers

#### It is important to tell your parent or teacher if:

- 1. A stranger wants you to leave with them.
- 2. Someone makes you feel uncomfortable.
- 3. A stranger tries to give you something.
- 4. A stranger wants you to keep a secret.

## staying safe around strangers

- You can trust a police officer or a firefighter.
- You can also talk to someone who works in a store or a restaurant (wearing a uniform or a nametag).
- You can also talk to a bus driver or a security guard.





## How to talk to a police officer

Tell the police officer your name. If you are finding it difficult to speak, show them an identification with your name on it.








## 2. What is the problem?


Tell or show the police officer what is the problem and what you need help with.
