A stranger is someone I don't know. They can be men or women. They can be nice or mean.






WHAT IS A STRANGER?

There are some strangers that are safe to talk to. It is important for me to learn which strangers are safe and which ones are not.





A family, or a mom or dad with a child, can be safe strangers for me to talk to.





A police officer is a safe stranger for me to talk to.





A firefighter is a safe stranger for me to talk to.





Someone wearing a uniform or a nametag can be a safe stranger for me to talk to.






Someone who asks me to leave with them or who tries to give me something is not a safe stranger.





Someone who tries to tell me a secret or who makes me feel uncomfortable is not a safe stranger.
