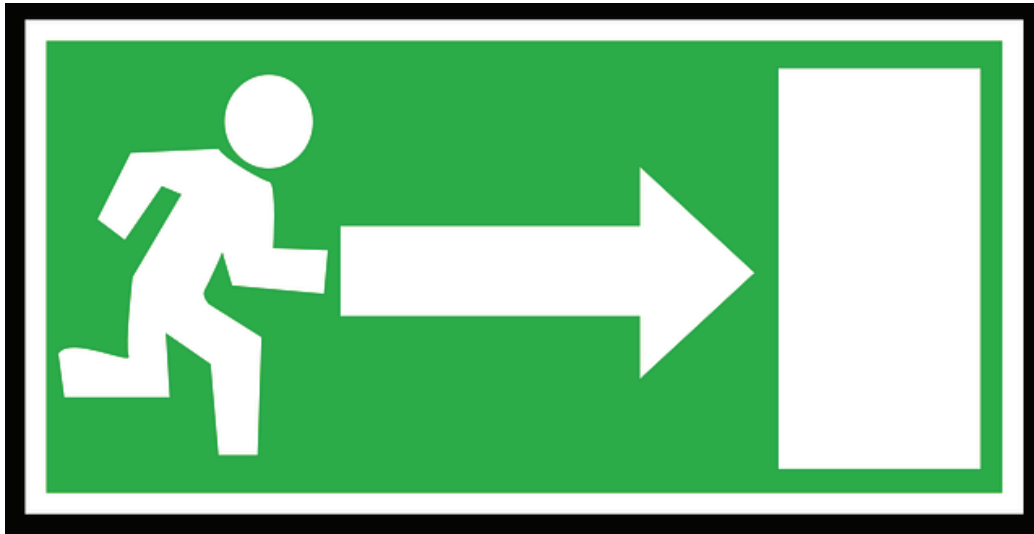







Fire Escape Plan
